THE JUAN MACLEAN

With his DFA label disc *Less Than Human*, robo-rocker (and former member of Six Finger Satellite) John Maclean—a.k.a. The Juan Maclean—synthesized the best bits of such '70s synth pioneers as Devo, Brian Eno, and Kraftwerk, then injected his own fresh take on electro dance beats. Maintaining strong emotional underpinnings throughout, Maclean's vision of the future celebrates the inevitability of human shortcomings while reveling in gleaming machine-like precision.
