
Not your typical art camp.....


This summer, work with practicing artists, experiment with cutting-edge technology, and develop your own ideas and expressions.

podcasting 101

JUNE 11-15 | 1-4 PM

Music fan? Storyteller? Internet geek? Join DJ and audio artist Julie Applegate for an exciting week of audio explorations when you can combine all the above. This fast-paced, exciting introductory class will teach you all the skills you need to develop, produce, and broadcast your own personal podcast. Using popular programs like Garage Band, Audacity, and iTunes, we'll brainstorm podcast topics, create our own theme songs, and begin broadcasting in iTunes. By the end of the week students will have produced their own podcast and will be able download their program from iTunes. No prior recording, mixing, or podcast experience necessary.

SCULPTURAL BOOKS

JUNE 18-22 | 1-4 PM

Pop-up books aren't just for little kids. In this class, we'll design and construct unique sculptural books using the techniques of professional pop-up book artists. Working with artist Ginny Baughman, you'll create your own weird and wonderful books with stories that come right off the page. We'll begin with a simple accordion book and finish the week by learning how to do a complicated tunnel book, both with 3D stories.




JUNE 18-22 | 1-4 PM

You'll work on everything from preliminary plot outlines to the final inking of your artwork. All skill levels are welcome!

Learn the art of model-making in this introduction to contemporary architecture. Join David Bailey in exploring newly built structures around campus. Then return to the drafting table to solve fun design problems and use simple materials to construct small building prototypes.


